

WHY ROLES?

- USERS:
 - To understand (and adapt) the social mechanisms that explain USERS BEHAVIOR.

- (Online) COMMUNITIES:
 - To understand, predict, enhance or prevent changes in the ecosystem of roles that affects the FITNESS OF A COMMUNITY.

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Role definitions in Sociology

Structuralism:

Roles are behavioral expectations that are associated with, and emerge from, identifiable positions in social structure.

<<Two entities have the same role

if they both are related to other entities in the same pattern.>> (Lorrain)

Structuralism in **Computer Science**:

- Blockmodels.
- Centrality metrics (e.g.: betweenes).
- Reputation metrics (e.g.: PageRank).

Role definitions in Sociology

(Symbolic) Interactionism:

Study of roles through the social **interactions** (meanings, etc).

Interactionism in **Computer Science**:


- Natural Language Processing.
- Conversation patterns (e.g.: motifs)



Some specific definitions:

- Roles as scripts of actors (Goffman):
 - A script a person plays in front of an audience.
 - Enactment of rights and duties attached to a given status.
- Roles as social tags (Skinner):
 - Roles are cognitive concepts used to store social meaning.
 - Social tags that codify how to interact with a tagged person.
- Roles as expected behaviours (Dictionary of Psycology)
 - The set of behaviours expected of a person possessing a certain social status.








Quantifying roles

Some specific definitions:

- Roles as scripts of actors (Goffman):
 - A **SCRIPT** a person plays in front of an audience.
 - Enactment of **RIGHTS** and **DUTIES** attached to a given status.
- Roles as social tags (Skinner):
 - Roles are COGNITIVE concepts used to store SOCIAL MEANING.
 - Social tags that codify how to INTERACT with a tagged person.
- Roles as expected behaviours (Dictionary of Psychology)
 - The set of BEHAVIORS expected of a person possessing a certain SOCIAL STATUS.

Quantifying roles


[The intuition is that] Any role is a combination of particular sets of **BEHAVIORAL**, **MEANINGFUL**, and **STRUCTURAL** attributes." (Welser)

(user)

(community)

BEHAVIOR, MEANING, STRUCTURE are **observable projections** of roles.

(for a machine [for now])





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Role Detection: approaches

Top Down (from roles to data)

- Find roles (defined a priori) in a community
- Techniques:
 - Supervised learning (?)
 - Metrics analysis
 - Visualization

Bottom Up (from data to roles)

- Hypothesis: set of relevant features or phenomena.
- Techniques:
 - Unsupervised learning
 - Blockmodels
 - Visualization

Ethnography

- Requieres to «live» in the community.
- Captures meaning, expectation...
- The most complete, the less automatizable.





Role Detection: approaches







- No silver bullet
 - Communities nature can change from forum to forum.
 - Universal roles (e.g.: troll)
 - Forum-specific roles (e.g.: expert)





- Know your community!
 - Are there communities in the forum?
 - How are them? (structure, dynamics, norms...)



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Analysis of IMDb - Internet Movie Database

- Discussion threads (topics) about films content
- Our dataset
 - Films sample:
 - Top 250 + Top 1000 with at least to 7500 votes + Bottom 100
 - 706 films
 - 1M posts
 - 102K threads
 - 117K users (at least 1 post)







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


Analysis of IMDb - friendship analysis




Analysis of IMDb - statistics of participations

■ Life/user in a thread


Users lifespan per thread (survival)

SEGMENTED ANALYSIS



Analysis of IMDb - segmented analysis

1-posters

- Wrote 1 post and then lurked or abandoned
 - 47.5% of users

Shy

- Participated in 1 thread and then lurked or abandoned
 - 5.3% of users

Regular users

- Between 2 and 10 threads on IMDb
 - 37%% of users

Pros

- Between 10 and 100 threads on IMDb
 - 9% of users

Super-actives

- More than 100 threads on IMDb
 - 0.7% of users



Analysis of IMDb - segmented analysis

- Superactives impulsive (and not really social)?
- Shy are more engaged in a thread. (they start 50% of their threads)
- Short lifes in threads.



Analysis of IMDb - segmented analysis

- How often do you start a thread?
 - One-posters: 16%
 - Shy: 41%
 - Regular: 18%
 - Pros: 16%
 - Superactives: 11%
- And when you start a thread, how often do they ignore you?
 - One-posters: 78% (else if thread already started: 48%)
 - Shy: 35% (else 37%)
 - Regular: 61% (else 41%%)
 - Pros: 57% (else 37%)
 - Superactives: 50% (else 36%)
 - One-posters highly ignored (it might take time)
 - Shy are thread starters
 - If you want to meet people, engage yourself in a discussion




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
PATTERNS OF CONVERSATIONS



Analysis of IMDb - Patterns of conversations




Analysis of IMDb - Patterns of conversations (%)



- Short threads: Q&A pattern (36)
- Long threads: cascade pattern (12)
- Question user conversates with some of her repliers (164)
- Some conversations between users (not the seed) in long threads (14) technicolor

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Conclusions

ROLES

- There is no unified definition. (and there might never be)
- ... but general agreement on common elements:
 - behavior,
 - structure,
 - meaning.
- IMDb
 - Conversations:
 - Conversations ad-hoc (users don't know each other from other films (threads?))
 - Different conversations in short and long threads.
 - Communities:
 - No evidence of communities in IMDb (yet: microcommunites?)
 - Social features could improve participation. (e.g.: integration with other SN)
- Conversation patterns (motifs)
 - Comprehensible technique to understand conversations.



Future work

ROLES

 Role detection must include time. (behavior, structure and even meaning are dynamic concepts)

IMDb (and forums)

- Analysis of evolution of shy, regulars, pros, and super actives.
 - How did they evolve from « 1 posters » and <<shy>>?
- Can the initial population of motifs predict the length of a thread?
- Better crawling strategy.
- Benchmark with other forums.
- Conversation patterns (motifs)
 - Analysis with temporal motifs.
 - Do different roles relate to different motifs?
 - Motifs as users' features for role detection.
- A mix bottom up top down strategy for role detection
